Victorian Christmas Customs Presentation Scheduled on December 2

Victorian Christmas customs will be presented by Kim Smith from the Presque Isle History Society on Wednesday, December 2, at 12:00 noon in the Edmunds Conference Center at NMCC. Smith will cover a number of topics in her presentation that involve the Christmas tree, including the origin of artificial trees, the concept of a village or train under the tree, Christmas tree lights and the tree stand. She will also discuss Victorian traditions and their evolution as it relates to Christmas cards, wrapping paper, Christmas carols and window displays. In addition to the discussion led by Smith, attendees will also learn how to make a Victorian ornament by making one themselves. Materials will be provided.
