

The **Student of the Year** should be a model student as well as an exemplar of community service to the campus and their classmates. He or she should embody the values of the campus, including a commitment to lifelong learning. This person will be the student speaker at commencement.

The Falcon Spirit Award is for those students who deserve special recognition for going above and beyond the call of duty to help make this campus a better place.

The NMCC Award of Excellence is a \$500 cash award presented to two well-rounded seniors who have a history of making good judgements, being generous in working with others, thinking creatively, and possessing high standards of integrity and excellence.

Written nominations should include why the student is deserving of the award, as well as information on the student's interests and activities, family, career plans, etc.

Medical Assistant Raffle


