Students Focus on World Famine and Feeding the Hungry in The County

NMCC humanities instructor Dave Raymond and many of the students in his ethics classes will be taking part in the national 30 Hour Famine for Hunger sponsored by World Vision. They will be fasting from 6:00 a.m. on April 22 until noon on April 23. Students participating in the 30 Hour Famine are turning to the NMCC campus and local community to help them raise money by making a donation to support their efforts. *Donations* are being accepted on their behalf in the NMCC college relations office, just off the Christie lobby. Donations are tax deductible, and receipts will be provided.

As part of the awareness process of this campaign, Raymond will lead a discussion on hunger at noon on Thursday, April 22, in the Edmunds Conference Center.

Volleyball Tourney & Car Show to be Held

Concessions will be available. All proceeds will go to the Pine Tree Chapter of the American Red Cross. The rain date is April 25, same time and place. Trophies will be awarded to a winner of each class, as voted on by the public.
