

Blood Drive to Be Held on Campus

At a time when the supply of blood and blood donors across the state and country are down, two NMCC student organizations are hoping their efforts to sponsor an American Red Cross Blood Drive on campus later this month will help.

The NMCC chapter of the Phi Theta Kappa student honor society and the Student Nurses Association will host the blood drive in the College gymnasium on Thursday, October 28, between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. In addition to encouraging students and employees to donate blood, the sponsors are inviting community members to join in the effort.

Some of our students know first hand the importance of having a blood supply readily available. Calvin Brewer, an automotive collision repair student, lost his arm in a work accident on Christmas Eve 2005. He credits many Red Cross blood donors for playing a role in saving his life.

Those who would like to donate blood can log on to www.redcrossblood.org or call 1-800-RED-CROSS to make an appointment or for more information. Appointments are not necessary, but are encouraged.

All presenting donors at the NMCC Blood Drive will receive a \$5 Eastern Mountain Sports Gear Bucks Card and have the opportunity to enter into a drawing to win an Eastern Mountain Sports Climbing School package and a \$50 gift card.

Charette to Be Inducted into Northern Maine Construction Hall of Fame at NMCC Ceremony

A well-known and highly-respected 94-year-old St. John Valley master craftsman, who worked more than seven decades in the building materials trade, has been named the 2010 inductee into the Northern Maine Construction Hall of Fame.

Ernest Charette of Fort Kent will be honored during a ceremony and reception on Thursday, October 21, at 5:00 p.m. in the Mailman Trades Building at NMCC.

Charette is credited with building a number of homes in the St. John Valley, as well as the bridge over Michaud Brook in Soldier Pond. He also designed and built the first and only private water system in Fort Kent that gravity fed water to a number of homes on Highland Avenue in Fort Kent. However, he is best known as an outstanding craftsman. He spent more than six decades in what his family calls "a small, cluttered, dusty woodworking shop crammed with bits and pieces of wood, saws and other equipment."
