Registration Begins for Spring Schedule

Course registration is getting underway. Seniors (those who have earned at least 30 credits) will be able to begin registering on-line on Friday, November 19, giving them first chance for courses they need to meet graduation requirements. First year students will be able to register for classes on-line beginning Monday, November 22. Non-matriculating students will be able to submit paper registration forms beginning Monday, November 29.

While registering on-line gives students more flexibility, and eliminates the waiting in line or the chasing of signatures, it also places more responsibility for the process on their shoulders. Before registering for classes, students should:


- 1. Resolve any Holds on your student account.** All Holds will prevent you from registering for classes. The only office that can

remove a Hold is the issuing office, so be sure to visit the office and resolve the issue as soon as practicable.

2. Make a tentative Spring '11 class schedule after reviewing the available courses.

Some classes have multiple times and locations, so make plans if you are unable to get into your first choice section...have an alternate section ready. If you really need a particular course to graduation....register early!

3. Be sure that you have reviewed your program graduation requirements and are registered for all of the appropriate classes.

Perhaps now is the time to make an appointment with your academic advisor to review where you are in relation to your graduation requirements. Don't take chances guessing that you have met all graduation requirements...know that you are taking the correct courses.

Remember, The Course Registration and Changes portlet is found by logging into my.NMCC.edu → clicking on the [Students] tab → clicking on the folder labeled [Academic Advising and Planning] → and scrolling down to the [Course Registration and Changes] portlet.

Hint: Course section numbers can usually help you determine if a class is being located at an off-campus center or during a special term. Always check the course location to be certain but feel free to use the following as a guide: Sections 30 - 39 (Winter Mini-term), 40 - 49 (Ashland), 50 - 59 (Evening - Main Campus), 60 - 69 (Houlton), 70 - 79 (Van Buren), 80 - 89 (Saint John Valley Center, Madawaska/Frenchville/Fort Kent).
