NMCC to Host African American Read-In

To help celebrate Black History Month in February, as well as to promote literacy, NMCC will be joining with organizations across the country in hosting a Read-In. Members of the campus and local community are invited to the Read-In at noon on Friday. February 11, in the NMCC library.

Coordinating the annual event is English instructor Jennifer Graham and Gail Roy, assistant dean of learning resources. To keep things interesting, the duo are taking a different direction with this year's Read-In.

"This year, we have asked students, faculty and staff to identify a piece of work by an African-American author that they like and to explain why they like the author or the work they selected," explained Graham. "This will result in more choice and will reflect what our campus identifies with in literature. In this sense, it will be more personal than in past years."

Graham plans to read the poem "Theme for English B" by Langston Hughes. "It's one of my favorite poems. Hughes explores the dynamic between a white teacher and black student at a time (1951) when diversity, in and out of the classroom,

In the poem, he points out that not only can students learn from instructors, but instructors can learn from their students. This poem is a good reminder for me to try to see things from my students' points of view and to learn from them and the experiences they bring to the classroom," said Graham.

To help facilitate the selection of readings for the February 11 event, as well as to celebrate Black History Month, the library will be hosting a display throughout the month of February of books by African American authors. A number of African American authors are represented at the NMCC library in a variety of genres.

"The Read-In encourages us to discover authors we might otherwise overlook and to recommend new books to add to the library's collection," said Roy.
