Totally Trades to Take Place April 27

A hands-on, day-long event designed to encourage girls to consider careers in fields traditionally dominated by men will bring together 100 participants from schools throughout Aroostook County on Wednesday, April 27, at NMCC.

The Totally Trades conference will feature sessions ranging from carpentry and green energy to heavy equipment operation and bridge building, all providing an opportunity for the girls to experience some aspect of the profession through a practical exercise.

"We want to give girls a hands-on workshop experience to spark their interest and raise awareness about a career field that they may not have previously considered, as well as provide female role models," said Suzanne Senechal-Jandreau, conference planner and regional manager of the Central Aroostook office of Women, Work and Community.

The conference is a free, oneday event for Aroostook County girls in grades 8 through 12. Funding is made possible through monies and in-kind services provided by the Maine DOT/Federal Highway Administration, Maine Department of Education, University of Maine at Augusta, Lane Construction Co., Time Warner Cable of Maine and Women Unlimited. Local sponsors include Northern Maine Development Commission, K-PEL Industrial Services, McCain Foods USA, Soderberg Construction, S.W. Collins, and NMCC, which serves as the host site for the event.

NMCC & PI Kiwanians Invite NMCC & Community to "Open House" for Sinawik #34

Hammers have been pounding and saws buzzing since early November in NMCC's residential construction lab as work on the 2011 Sinawik House has been underway. As the home building project nears completion, students and faculty are inviting the campus and community to come view their handiwork at an open house and barbecue on Tuesday, April 26, between 11:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. in the Mailman Trades Building.

The 1,400 square foot modular ranch-style home sits in two pieces inside the residential construction facility at the College. It is there where more than four dozen students and their instructors in five trade and technical occupations programs have spent the past six months making the home become reality.

Graduation to be Held at Forum; Speakers Named

A record number of graduates, including the first associate degree wind power technology students trained in New England, will be among the highlights of NMCC commencement exercises on May 14.

The 274 students earning a total of 290 associate degrees or certificates will also take part in another first: the first commencement ceremony held off campus in more than a generation. As enrollment has grown in recent years to an all-time high of more than 1,100 students, the venue used to hold the event for more than three decades, the College gymnasium, will give way to The Forum in Presque Isle for the class of 2011.
