NMCC students honored for academic achievement and campus involvement

Aroostook County - More than 50 Northern Maine Community College students had an opportunity to shine recently as they were recognized in front of family members and College faculty and administrators during the annual Student Honors and Achievement Awards Ceremony. Students were honored for academic excellence as well as for campus involvement.

"For many of our students, this is the first opportunity for them to receive recognition at this level," said Bill Egeler, dean of students. "I believe it's important that we recognize our students for their academic achievements and accomplishments, not only because it is so well deserved, but also because it sets a benchmark for other students.
