Technology Then & Now

Class Cancellation Procedure

With the first storm of the season safely behind us, it is a good time to review NMCC'c class cancellation procedure.

While the college does not typically close due to inclement weather, in cases of extreme weather conditions, classes may be cancelled or the College closed early. Any decision to cancel daytime classes will be made by 6:00 a.m., and the decision not to hold evening classes will be made by 4:00 p.m.

Any College wide closing will be sent to students and employees using the emergency alert system. Since we are using a new system from last year, it is especially important that ALL students and employees go on-line to the portal and make sure that their contact information is current and that they have "opted in" to the system.

After you log in to the portal (my. nmcc.edu), go to the IT-Facilities tab and click on the "RaveAlert Instant Alert" heading in the left column. Messages regarding closing will be sent to all of the phone numbers and e-mails that you have listed.

Announcements will also be posted under the "Take Note" section on the College's website (www.nmcc. edu).
