Be Resume-Ready for the Job Fair

NMCC's annual JOB FAIR is scheduled for Thursday, March 8, from 9am to 1pm in the gym.

Are you ready with an updated, professional, eye-appealing resume that will convince potential employers that you are qualified for the job they have open?

Consider these tips:

Does your resume include the skills cited in the job descrip-1. tion (or advertisement) for the position you seek?

Is your resume typographically perfect, professionally 2. presented, and current?

Is your work experience applicable? If not, have you empha-3. sized transferable skills of which the employer should be aware?

Have you adequately explained gaps in employment? 4.

5. Have you explained in appropriate detail your recent education and the skills developed at school that are also useful in the workplace?

Have you detailed special skills that stand you out from 6. your competitors in the job search – a foreign language, unique computer skills, related military experience, volunteerism in which you've developed job-related skills, etc.?

Have you eliminated all personal information? 7.

Have you quantified where possible? (In other words, rather 8. than saying you have supervised a work crew, indicate that you have supervised teams or crews of 4 - 20 by planning, organizing and leading them in their assigned tasks.)

Have you stressed the contributions you are able to make to 9. the company? (Remember, the recruiter has to determine why YOU are the best candidate for the job, so you need to provide sufficient detail to start that process pre-interview.)

10. Have you made it easy for the recruiter to contact you by providing phone numbers where you are most likely reached during the work day?

Being prepared for the Job Fair requires time and energy, but the pay off just might be a pay check! Look for tips on making the most of the Job Fair in next week's newsletter!
