Registration for Summer Classes Begins; Fall Registration to Follow

The Summer 2013 schedule is now available for viewing purposes. Students can access the information by logging onto the NMCC portal and clicking on the academic tab.

A couple of things to note:

- There are two "sessions" during the summer semester, so students should be sure that check on the beginning and ending dates for each class that is listed.
- There are several on-line course offerings this summer. Once the class list is available, the instructor will contact enrolled students regarding any special information needed, so those who sign up for an on-line course should be sure to check their NMCC e-mail account as time draws near for the beginning of the summer semester.

Registration for summer classes begins on Wednesday, March 13. Students are encouraged to meet with their academic advisors to review their academic needs for the summer



semester. The summer semester is an excellent opportunity to catch up on some course requirements or to get ahead to ease your load during the next academic year.

Just a reminder that registration for summer classes cannot be done electronically. Students must register using the paper form, which can be printed off from the NMCC portal. Information on the process is available in Student Services.

The fall schedule should be available soon. Students should keep an eye out on the NMCC portal for it to be posted or watch their emails for a notification from the acadmic dean.


