Creative Writers Reading Series Concludes; Book Signing Planned

The Creative Writers Reading Series concludes on **Wednesday, April 24**, at **noon** in the library with guest author Monica Wood.

Wood is the author of When We Were the Kennedys: A Memoir from Mexico, Maine, a New England indie bestseller; #1 indie bestseller in Maine: a national Indie Next pick: and an Oprah's 2012 Summer Reading pick. Wood is also the author of four works of fiction, most recently Any Bitter Thing, which spent twentyone weeks on the American Booksellers Association extended bestseller list and was named a Book Sense Top Ten pick. Her other fiction includes Ernie's Ark, Secret Language, and My Only Story, a finalist for the Kate Chopin Award.

Wood will not only by taking part in a noon presentation, but will also be on hand earlier in the morning for a book signing. The library, with the support of a grant from the Maine Humanities Council, will host a presentation by Wood from **10:30** -**11:30 a.m.**, including a book signing for her book, *When We Were the Kennedys*.

These sessions are free and open to the public.

Students & Instructors to Take Part in 30 Hour Famine

NMCC instructors Dave Raymond and Eric Pelkey and students from their World Religion and Ethics classes will be taking part this week in World Vision's 30 Hour Famine for Hunger.

The groups will fast for 30 hours beginning on the morning of Thursday, April 25, and ending at noon on Friday. The intent is to both raise awareness of the issue of world hunger as well as to raise money to help feed people.

There are 925 million hungry around the world...about three times the population of the United States. An estimated 7,000 children younger than 5 day each day from causes related to hunger.

Every dollar raised through the 30 Hour Famine can help feed and care for a child for a day. And World Vision isn't just helping for a day, or a month, or a year; they stay over the long haul to help families become self-sufficient.

Raymond, Pelkey and their students are collecting donations to help them reach their fundraising goal. For those who would like to support the cause, to make the process as easy as possible, donations are being accepted at the information window in the Christie lobby throughout the week. Checks should be made out to World Vision.

Efforts such as this do make a difference. In the last 20 years, the number of kids who die every day because of hunger, disease and poverty has dropped from 40,000 to just over 20,000, thanks in part to efforts like the 30 Hour Famine and organizations like World Vision.

Film Series Continues; Presentation to Take Place

The Islamic film series that began last week continues this Wednesday evening, **April 24**, at **7:00 p.m.** in the Edmunds Conference Center with the showing of *Islamic Art: Mirror of the Invisible World*. This documentary transports viewers over nine countries and across 1,400 years of cultural history to reveal the astonishing riches of Muslim art, crafts and architecture.


The series, which is possible through a Bridging Cultures bookshelf grant, is being facilitated by NMCC English instructor Eric Pelkey.

"This series is a great way for our campus and community to explore the rich cultural heritage of Islam," said Pelkey, who lived in a predominantly Muslim country during his Peace Corps service. In addition to the film series, a presentation on two books from the 25 books added to the library through the grant, will be held in the library this **Friday, April 26**, at **12:00 noon**.

NMCC English instructors Jan Grieco and Lynne Nelson- Manion will lead a discussion on *The Butterfly Mosque* and *In the Country of Men*.

"Much of what we know about the Islamic world is only bits and pieces delivered to us by news reports and political discussions," said Grieco. "This series shows us beauty and humanity."
