Welcome Back Breakfast

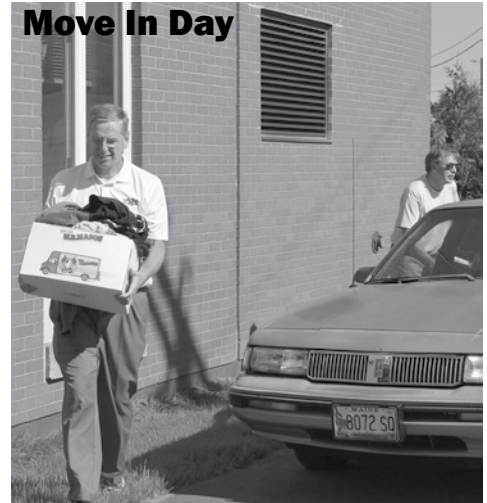
