## NMCC Precision Metals Manufacturing Program Receives High Tech Donation

The Precision Metals Manufacturing (PMM) program at Northern Maine Community College has received a significant contribution from the Mitutoyo America Corporation of Illinois. Mitutoyo specializes in precision measuring tools including coordinate measuring machines (CMM).

The \$7500 donation includes computer hardware, software and a monitor that allows students to write programs for part inspections. This ability makes verification of dimensional requirements for various parts more efficient. The equipment went on line this fall and expands on the capability of existing equipment.

According to PMM instructor Dean Duplessis, Mitutoyo works closely with HAAS Technical Education Centers to positively impact precision machining programs that demonstrate a commitment to excellence. Over the years, HAAS, one of the largest machine tool builders in the world, has donated several pieces of equipment to NMCC.

Duplessis maintains a number of connections in the industry which has been helpful in securing these major donations.

"We've had a number of employers that have hired NMCC graduates who have stepped up on our behalf and said [to large corporations] if you're going to make an investment in an educational environment, NM is one of the places we think you ought to make that investment," says Duplessis who is proud to say the only difference between the NM Precision Metals program and industry is the size of the program.
