

## **Poet to Visit Creative Writing Class**

UMPI professor and poet Melissa Crowe will visit John Corrigan's Introduction to Creative Writing class on Tuesday, March 13, from 6:00-7:00 p.m. Crowe will read some of her poems and talk to the class about both her works and poetry in general.

After attending Presque Isle public schools and earning her bachelor's degree in English from the University of Maine, Crowe earned her MFA in poetry from Sarah Lawrence and her Ph.D. in English from the University of Georgia. Her poems, essays, and reviews have appeared recently or are forthcoming in *Mothering Magazine, Calyx: A Journal of Art and Literature by Women, Lifeboat: A Journal of Memoir, Crab Orchard Review, The Georgia Review, The Atlanta Review,* and *The Seneca Review.* This year, she is a recipient of a Barbara Demming/Money for Women grant for her poetry manuscript SKINTIGHT. She teaches writing and literature at the University of Maine at Presque Isle.

After Crowe's presentation, the students will continue with their workshop of student poems.


