NMCC's Continuing Education Division hosted a new program, "college 4 kids," on the NMCC campus to help middle-school students get a better understanding of what a college campus is like. The program ran April 7-11 from 3:00-5:00 pm each afternoon. The five different subjects, one each afternoon, included Study Skills instructed by Johna Lovely, Guitar Lessons with Jeremy Tweedie, Origami with Yusuf Ghodgeri, CPR/First Aid taught by Scott Michaud and Staying Safe Online with Shawn Lahey.

Eleven students attending the CPR/First Aid course will all receive a nationally-recognized certification from the American Heart Association.

"We hope this opportunity will inspire students to think about their future options before they reach the high-school level. It can be stressful for a high-school student to decide on a career path and begin the college application process. This will allow them to get a feel for how things work and to start thinking about their future a little earlier," said Shawn Lahey, CED business & industry coordinator.
