Tim—Quality Center projects under development: Practical Nursing and Twin Rivers. The PN program will be for 32 students and get the nursing home health care industry to get involved. Agreement should be signed later this week. Nursing Home health care people will be contacted this week. We will need nursing faculty involved for nursing classes at beginning of second semester. Students need to be enrolled and into related classes ASAP. Health Care facilities have people ready for this. Once approved we will get faculty involved in how this will be delivered.

Leah—Twin Rivers (Madawaska) 1-year QC project...electrical training (ENI) and papermaking training and that may translate into millwright program in the future. We will have all 461 employees. QC will invest about \$200K—Twin Rivers will match about \$65K plus remainder in cash. Hoping this might be the first of a 3-year partnership with TR since they want a number of trainings. The company is facing a big retirement cliff and the union contract was voted down. Most of training will be done in Madawaska but some here. *Background:* We've done a lot of training for them in the past. They have many NM graduates especially from the Electrical and Welding programs. Quality Centers is money available through the Community College System and funding is available to each campus. Funding is to help companies grow. The program requires a 50% match from the industry. This is the <u>Put Me to Work</u> program—straight Quality Center program offers 100% funding. No cost to the students. Customized training. We will check to see if faculty has an interest in the training of employees.

Tim—We want to get PN on the books by October deadline. We will push this hard.

- Any courses for Sitel by October? It would be good to get some credit hours on the books by October 15. Bill says we could have a Late-Start offering. Some people will be eligible for financial aid.
- Leah—At Twin Rivers any courses in Welding will be credit courses but will only be ready for next fall's head count.
- Tim—Charlie Collins (of Quality Center program at System office) will be here tomorrow to talk about PN.
- President Daigler won't be available for few days. Work through Helen or Rob if you need anything at the System.

Mike—Two vendors are on site in the Automotive lab. Tammy is representing the business office.

Barry—Contractors are installing equipment in gym this week: basketball wenches, mats.

- Access control issues to work through.

Bill—System is involved in the HOPE 100 legislation for navigators; not sure of the details.
