Education Summit to Be Held

Educators and business representatives from throughout Northern Maine will be on campus on Wednesday, May 2, for a first-of-its-kind, County-wide gathering to discuss how to best prepare students for college, careers, and civic participation. The Aroostook County Educational Summit, a collaborative effort of the Aroostook Partnership for Progress, Northern Maine Community College, the University of Maine at Presque Isle, and the University of Maine at Fort Kent, is a day-long event designed to engage the County educational and business communities in a meaningful dialogue about the challenges and opportunities facing both.

Participants will include secondary teachers and administrators, post-secondary teachers and administrators, and business leaders.
