- EMS simulation center—4 design firms sent in qualifications and will be interviewed. Campus Committee will be established this week.
- RFP for flooring for 3rd floor. Admissions, IT and Development what would it cost to replace the rug.
- Jon and Lee are looking at apartments for repairs on Washington and Penobscot and will send list to Barry, Bill and Tim.
- COVID funding- Air quality in classrooms HEPA filters have been approved by the CDC checking to see if COVID funds can be used. Ongoing costs are high with this system.
- Access control design is underway—Checking to see if 3rd round of funding can be used.
- Courtyard needs repairs with shifting/cracking problems.
- Training for PII is underway—only a couple of offices left to train. Faculty will also have to be trained
