Officials with NMCC and the Maine Quality Centers program will enter into separate training partnership agreements with two central Aroostook businesses at a press conference and signing ceremony in the Edmunds conference center at NMCC on Tuesday, September 18, at 2:00 p.m.

The memoranda of understanding with the Presque Isle-based BurrellesLuce facility and the Pattison Sign Group operations at the Loring Commerce Center will forge partnerships between each company and NMCC, whereby the continuing education division of the College will develop training for company employees in various areas identified as critical to each. The projects, made possible through the Maine Quality Centers, an economic development initiative of the Maine Community College System, will provide the training at no cost to both BurellesLuce and the Pattison Sign Group.
