Information Displays in Lobby Serve as a Valuable Tool

The displays that have been placed in many areas of the campus are a great tool for delivering important academic information, campus events and other messages to the students. Recently, the College has placed two large displays in the Christie Lobby that expand this system beyond just a PowerPoint presentation. Thanks to a product called SignagePro, from Applica/SmartAVI, the College can now deliver content to the displays in the lobby in various forms.

The IT staff researched many methods from multiple vendors and chose this thin-client based solution as the one that most suited the College's needs. This system can output presentations, movie clips, still pictures, a news ticker and more. Faculty, staff and students have always benefited from the system and can now have more technology-rich, enjoyable experience learning about what's happening on campus.

As you may have noticed, one of the lobby displays has been cycling a PowerPoint presentation, the same information on the ceiling-hung televisions, with important messages for the campus community. This content has been provided by various groups and/or people on campus, from the student organizations to the continuing education division and everyone in between. The other display is intended for promotional media, to be utilized mainly for the public.
