Careers in Construction Week Events

Aroostook County will soon be home to the Northern Maine Construction Hall of Fame, with the official opening and induction of the first five honorees taking place on Tuesday, October 16, at 5:00 p.m. at a ceremony in the Mailman Trades Building. The Hall of Fame reception is planned as part of the College's celebration of National Careers in Construction Week, which this year falls October 15 through 19.

Prior to the reception, Greg Miller of Cianbro, one of the largest construction and construction services companies on the East Coast, will speak to seniors in the building construction trades on Tuesday, October 16, at 3:00 p.m. in Edmunds Conference Center. The session is also open to the public. He will speak about the current state of the industry and future outlook in Maine and beyond. Miller will also speak to more than 80 members of the various trade and technical occupation program advisory committees at an annual meeting later in the evening.

Also as part of the week's activities, Mark Goodin and Rodney MacDougal of N.H. Bragg will conduct an afternoon seminar on fall protection and personal protective equipment on Thursday, October 18, at 1:00 p.m. in the residential construction lab, In addition to students, faculty are opening the session up to local contractors and their employees.
