# NM to Expand Offerings in the St. John Valley, Will Host Forum on October 25

Within the coming weeks, NMCC will open a new off-campus center in the St. John Valley at Madawaska High School as the College continues to expand its service to the northernmost part of Aroostook. As final preparations are made to open the center, NMCC campus leaders are turning to the local communities to hear what program and course offerings would best meet the needs of the region.

An important step in that process will take place on Thursday, October 25, at 6:30 p.m. in the Madawaska High School Library, when College officials and representatives of the St. John Valley Adult and Community Education Collaborative host an open forum for business and community leaders. The purpose of the session is to hear directly from employers and others in the Valley about the current and anticipated future needs for education and training and to better learn how NMCC, in partnership with the adult education collaborative, can help ensure the region has a vibrant and viable workforce moving forward.

Representatives of businesses throughout the St. John Valley and others interested in discussing the education and training needs the County's Community College could deliver in the region are encouraged to attend the open forum. Refreshments will be served.
