Torch Relay to be Held

Employees and students are invited to join in a ceremony and rally in the courtyard area just outside the Christie Complex on Monday, November 5, at 10 a.m. During the event, a torch that will be used on Election Night to light a "bond" fire and celebrate regional awareness efforts by the County's college and universities about bond questions 2 and 3 will be ceremonially lit and relayed across the Star City.

Escorted by emergency response vehicles from the Presque Isle Police Department and Presque Isle Fire Department, NMCC representatives will carry the torch to the corner of State and Main Streets in the downtown. At that point, President Crowley – who will serve as the final NMCC torchbearer - will hand it over to UMPI President Don Zillman, who will lead off the University section of the relay. University students and personnel will guide the torch to campus, and place it in a stand near the Gentile Hall parking area - the site of the "bond" fire that will be held at UMPI on Election Night.

The "bond" fire will begin at 8 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 6, in the open area behind Gentile Hall.
