NMCC and Husson Form Innovative Partnership



An innovative partnership between a public and private institution was made official at a signing ceremony and press conference held at NMCC on September 14. NMCC President Timothy Crowley (left) and Husson President William Beardsley signed the document which establishes a Husson presence on the NMCC campus, providing space for Husson's evening and weekend courses and programs at both the baccalaureate and master's level, as well as an on-campus office location that will serve as the administrative center for Husson in Aroostook County. A significant aspect of the agreement is Husson's guarantee of admission into one or more of its baccalaureate programs to any NMCC student who graduates from an associate degree program with a grade point average of 3.00 or above. Husson has further agreed to accept all credit hours awarded from NMCC. Look for more details on this exciting agreement in the October monthly edition of *Toward Excellence*.
