### **Torch Relay Reminder**

Please join us in a ceremony and rally in the courtyard area just outside the Christie Complex on Monday, November 5, at 10 a.m. During the event, a torch that will be used on Election Night to light a "bond" fire will be ceremonially lit and relayed across the Star City. NMCC students and employees will carry the torch to the corner of State and Main Streets in the downtown, where it will be handed off for the UMPI section of the relay. University students and personnel will guide the torch to campus, and place it in a stand near Gentile Hall parking area – the site of the "bond" fire on Election Night. The "bond" fire will begin at 8 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 6, and all are invited to attend!

Please remember to go to the polls and vote on Tuesday, November **6**. In addition to several location elections, there are five statewide bal-



lot questions on which Mainers will be voting. They are: a citizen initiative to allow a Maine tribe to run a harness race track with slot machines in Washington County; a referendum to extend term limits for legislators from 4 to 6 terms; and three bond questions.

As you are no doubt aware by now, Question 3 would provide \$43.5 million for interior and exterior building renovations, improvements and additions at all campuses of the Maine Community College System, the Maine Maritime Academy, and the University of Maine System. Of that, \$758,000 would come to NMCC to help with renovations in the Mailman Trades Building and the A.K. Christie complex.


