## **Maine Community College System Board of Trustees to Meet at NMCC**

A regularly scheduled meeting of the Maine Community College System Board of Trustees will be held on Wednesday, November 14, at NMCC. The meeting will begin at 12:30 p.m. in the Edmunds Conference Center.

The meeting will include a report from the Board's Educational Policy Committee and a vote to authorize implementation of the one-year medical coding program of study at NMCC. The Board will also consider a recommendation from its Finance and Facilities Committee to accept the System's FY07 audited financial statements. Also on the agenda are resolutions to adopt new or amended policies related to the student code of conduct, computer and network use, and firearm possession and discharge. The Board will also vote to accept a number of gifts to the MCCS.

We welcome the members of the Board of Trustees, the presidents of each of Maine's Community Colleges, MCCS President John Fitzsimmons and several staff members from the MCCS office to campus!!


