Scholarship Opportunities for Community College Students

In addition to the many scholarship opportunities through the College's Foundation, students may be eligible for many scholarship opportunities available regionally or nationally. A few with upcoming deadlines are:

Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation: Awards 400 scholarships annually of \$1,000-\$2,000 to students attending two-year higher education institutions granting terminal degrees. Students can apply March-May 2008 for a scholarship for the next academic year. For eligibility requirements, go to <u>www.</u> coca-colascholars.org.

Jack Kent Cooke Foundation: Annually awards approximately 50 scholarships worth up to \$30,000 to students and recent alumni from community colleges transferring to a four-year institution. The application deadline is February 1. For more information, including eligibility requirements, see www.jackkentcookefoundation.org.

Hispanic Scholarship Fund: Annually awards 200 scholarships of \$1,250 to \$2,500 to students transferring from a two-year college to a four-year institution. Application deadline is March 15. For eligibility criteria or to apply on-line, go to <u>www.hsf.net</u>.

Since only one student can be nominated per campus for the Coca-Cola scholarship and only two students/alumni for the Jack Kent Cooke scholarship, applications/requests to be nominated must be coordinated through the College's financial aid office. Students eligible for the Hispanic Scholarship Fund may apply directly on-line.

Students should check the portal or stop by the financial aid office to learn more about various opportunities throughout the year.

Students and employees will once again benefit from reduced rates for skiing, snowboarding, and something new this year--tubing, at Big Rock in Mars Hill.

All NMCC employees and students can purchase daily lift and snow tubing tickets for \$5/day. Spouses and children living in the homes of students/employees can purchase tickets at 25% off the daily lift ticket prices when accompanying an NMCC student/employee. Students/employees may also purchase a season pass for skiing for only \$150. To take advantage of any of these bargains, the student/employee must present his or her college ID.
