Three noon-time sessions will be held featuring readings from both a guest writer as well as students from the College that will provide an opportunity for those who love literature to hear original work by both experienced, published writers and talented beginners. *Each session will be held from 12:00-1:00 p.m. in the College's library, beginning on April 10.*

The series celebrating literature has been made possible through a grant from the Maine Writers' and Publishers' Alliance located in Portland that serves writers and publishers throughout the State.


