Toward Execulence

Instructor to Take Part in 30 Hour Famine

NMCC humanities instructor Dave Raymond has challenged his Ethics class to apply moral theory to real life. He is requiring each of his students to complete a service learning project, doing at least one act of 'goodness' to someone other than an immediate family member, close friend or social organization that he or she already supports.

He is modeling the assignment for his students by participating in the 30 Hour Famine to raise money for world famine relief. He will be fasting for 30 hours on April 25-26 in order to both raise awareness for world hunger as well as solicit financial support from the NMCC campus community for this worthy cause.

Every dollar donated makes a difference! One dollar will feed a child for a day...so \$7 feeds a child for a week, and for only \$30, you can feed a child for a month.

Right now, more than 850 million people around the world don't have enough to eat. Annually, more than 10 million children under the age of five die from disease and malnutrition as a result of hunger. But world hunger is 100 percent preventable, and YOU can help make a difference by supporting this local effort!

Donations may be either a flat amount or a pledge per hour. Staff in the college relations office (at the information window in the Christie lobby) will be collecting donations on behalf of Mr. Raymond to support 30 Hour Famine. Donations are tax deductible, and a receipt will be provided.

30 Hour Famine is undertaken annually by World Vision, with the funds raised helping to feed and to care for children in poverty-afflicted countries around the globe. Since 1992, 30 Hour Famine has raised more than \$100 million, representing countless saved lives.

Some of his students may opt to join Mr. Raymond in his efforts, while others will choose other people or organizations to support. Look for more details soon on the community service endeavors being undertaken by the class.

April 17 - Fiction - Featuring Kasey Grieco
Kasey writes fiction and non-fiction, and has taught English, literature, and writing at Emerson College, NMCC, and UMPI. Her work has appeared in Portland Magazine, The MacGuffin, and Echoes.

The last session will be held on April 24, focusing on non-fiction. The series celebrating literature was made possible through a grant from the Maine Writers' and Publishers' Alliance.
