#### Take Note...

#### **Peer Tutors Needed**

There will be a few openings for peer tutors in the Academic Success Center for the upcoming academic year. The primary responsibility of a peer tutor is to facilitate student learning by helping to clarify specific course content and by promoting/modeling the use of appropriate study strategies.

Tutors must have obtained a B or higher in the course(s) which they intend to tutor and have at least a 2.5 GPA and must receive a supportive recommendation from faculty in the content area(s) to be tutored. Also, all new tutors are required to complete an online tutor training program.

# **Community Service Reminders...**

♪ Donations are being accepted through the end of the month for World Vision, to help feed hungry children around the world. Instructor Dave Raymond took part in the 30 Hour Famine sponsored by World Vision, fasting for 30 hours on Thursday and Friday to help raise money and awareness for the cause. Money is being collected on his behalf at the information window in the Christie lobby.

Items are being collected through the end of the month by Aroostook Mental Health Center's Sexual Assault Services for kits that they will prepare for local hospitals to be used for victims of sexual violence. Items being collected include: travel size shampoo, conditioner, body wash, deodorant, and toothpaste; tooth brushes; track pants, sweat shirts, and tank tops, sizes L-XXL; black or navy tote bags; underwear; socks; and comb/brush sets. There is a collection box in the Christie lobby.

#### **Residential Construction Raffle & Auction**
