College to Host Exercise to Test Emergency Preparedness

Campus and community members should not be alarmed to see more fire trucks, police cruisers and ambulances around the community, particularly at NMCC, on Saturday, September 20. Local responders, hospitals, law enforcement officials (local, county and state), and regional hazardous materials response teams will be joining forces to test their preparedness during an exercise at the College.

"We will be using a terrorism scenario; however, these agencies would be working together in a mass casualty or major emergency of any kind, here or in another part of the state. We will be thoroughly testing our ability to work together smoothly," said Vern Ouellette, director of the Aroostook County Emergency Management Agency, the group coordinating the exercise in collaboration with the Maine Emergency Management Agency.

The exercise will test communication systems and operating protocols that are used statewide, providing valuable information on best practices to be shared and improvements that could be implemented.

"All of the agencies responding have good plans and extensive training, and this scenario will put all that to the test. We expect all response units to do well, but also that we will find things to improve upon. That's why we exercise, to test our plans and training in the field, and to get better at what we do," said Ouellette.

This particular exercise will test not just the responders on the scene, but also the City's Emergency Operations Center and The Aroostook Medical Center's ability to handle multiple patients and decontamination capabilities.

Funding and support of this exercise is provided through the Maine Emergency Management Agency Exercise Program and the Department of Homeland Security.
