Students Urged to Register to Vote

By casting a ballot, each one of us has a voice in deciding who will serve in office and what major issues will be covered in the governing of our state and nation!

For students who are new to the voting process, step one is becoming registered. Any Maine resident who would like to register to vote can do so in a variety of ways. Please stop by Betsy Harris' office (located in student services) before October 14 and complete a voter registration application, and be sure to bring bring your driver's license. Other ways to register include going to your town office, any motor vehicle branch office, most federal and state social service agencies or voter registration drives. You can even register on Election Day at your hometown office or city hall.

Campus residents may want to request an absentee ballot if driving home on Election Day is inconvenient for you. After you have registered to vote, you may request an absentee ballot application - call your town or city clerk for an application and assistance.

By voting, you are keeping Maine's democracy strong; and, if you don't vote, your voice will not be heard. Please register and vote.
