Campus & Local Community Invited to Abraham Lincoln Presentation

Humanities instructor David Raymond will lead a presentation focusing on Abraham Lincoln, and the role that religion played in Lincoln's life both in and out of the White House, on Thursday, February 12 (the 200th anniversary of Lincoln's birth), at 12:00 noon in the College library.

"In his speeches and writings Lincoln reveals himself as a profound thinker about God and spiritual matters, but in his daily life he did not practice his faith in a conventional way," said Raymond. "The purpose of my research and talk is to better understand the profoundly deep faith of this pivotal figure in American history."
