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Teams and players sought for Community Volleyball Tournament at NMCC to benefit Veterans

Aroostook County - Members of the Student Senate at Northern Maine Community College are looking to the community for participation as they prepare to host their sixth annual "Support Maine Veterans" Volleyball Tournament on Saturday, April 11, beginning at 9:00 a.m. in the college gymnasium. The tournament is held each year to raise money for the Maine Veterans' Home in Caribou.

While students and employees at the college will make up some of the teams in the tournament, the group is turning to local businesses, organizations and community members who want to join in. All players will receive a tournament t-shirt.

Each team of six to eight players is expected to raise at least \$100 in order to enter the tournament. Teams with one or more players who have competed on a volleyball team will play in a competitive bracket, while those who are playing just for fun will participate in a recreational bracket.

Companies or organizations that cannot form a group of their own but wish to support the event may opt to either pledge a donation to one of the competing teams or form an "honorary" team. According to NMCC Student Senate advisor Dennis Albert, teams donating \$100 but not playing will be listed as honorary teams supporting the effort. "Everybody's participation, whether it is physical or monetary, will be greatly appreciated," said Albert.

All proceeds from the tournament will be donated to the Caribou Veterans' Home activity fund. "The event makes it possible to provide entertainment and transportation to the residents and to pay for birthday, Christmas gifts, and fun activities that include Pizza and Pajama night. The activity is a great team building experience for the employees as well," said Trish Theriault, administration coordinator at the Caribou Veterans' Home. The donations provided from the tournament also help to purchase personal needs items for veterans with financial need.

Approximately \$2000 was raised during last year's tournament, and the Student Senate's goal is to raise that number to \$2500 this year.
