Women's History Month to be Celebrated

Members of the campus and local community are invited to the NMCC library on Thursday, March 26, at 12:00 noon to listen to readings from work by and about Native American and Maine women writers. The student readings will include works by Sarah Orne Jewett, Gladys Hasty Carroll, Ruth Moore, Edna St. Vincent Millay, Joy Harjo, Cathie Pelletier, Louise Eldrich, Carolyn Chute, Leslie Marmon Silko and others.

English instructor Jan Grieco will begin the hour long program with a brief overview of the contributions of women writers to the field of literature, with a focus on Maine and the Native American experience. This event is being held to commemorate Women's History Month.

PI 150th Birthday Bash at NMCC
