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Jewelry Creation & Design class to be offered

Aroostook County - Jewelry Creation and Design, a nine-hour hands on course that will teach participants how to make their own jewelry, will begin on Saturday, September 19, at Northern Maine Community College. The course will meet from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon on alternating Saturdays – September 19, October 3 and October 17.

“It’s fun when you learn to make jewelry for yourself, your friends or family, or for profit. These three classes will teach you basic jewelry making techniques and designs. You can make the same kind of jewelry you’ve seen in magazines and stores! You’ll use only simple tools & materials: pliers, wire, cord; lampwork beads, as well as, beads made of wood, silver, copper, or glass for accent,” explains Laura McPherson, who will be teaching the course. “After practicing a bit, you’ll get wonderful results. From then on, your jewelry will take shape with the aid of your own imagination and creativity.”

McPherson is the co-owner of Sunrise Beads in Mapleton. Using glass and other materials, McPherson and her husband, Randy, make beads which they market to jewelry designers all over the world. She has been making jewelry for four years, while she and her husband have been creating glass lampwork beads for nine years.

Lamp working, also called torch working or flame working, is the sculpting of glass rods by heating and melting the glass in the flame of a gas-powered torch. The torch worker has a high degree of control over how melted the glass becomes, as a result they are able to create pieces with immaculate detail and complexity.

In the jewelry creation and design class being offered, participants will create two bracelets, a necklace, and three sets of earrings. Then, as a bonus, after the last class, McPherson and her husband will demonstrate torch making glass beads.

While participants will each receive a bead kit, personalized based on their individual color choices, they are expected to provide some of their own tools for the course. A tool list will be provided upon registration. The cost of the course is \$65, plus the cost of supplies, which is \$18. The class is limited to ten people.
